

School District of Auburndale Survey FAQ

1. My paper survey did not have an access code to take it online, what should I do?

Answer: You have several options!

A. You can take the survey on paper and send it in.

B. You should have received a postcard with your unique access code and you can use that to take the survey online.

C. You can call the District office, 715-652-2117, for an access code.

2. What if a second adult in my household would like to take the survey?

Answer: Please call the District office, 715-652-2117, and we will give you another access code, or a second paper copy, for that person.

3. How long do I have to take the survey?

Answer: Surveys will be collected until June 24, 2020, electronically. Mailed surveys should be sent by that date.

4. How do I find out about the survey results?

Answer: The survey results will be reported at the July Board of Education Meeting, and then will be posted on the district website.

5. Is the \$300,000 to improve performance space in the old high school gym (included in the \$11.2M option) still needed if we build the Community Performing Arts Center?

Answer: No. We would only spend that amount if the Community Performing Arts Center is not supported.

6. Is the Performing Arts Center dedicated to performances, or is it multi-purpose?

Answer: It is a multi-purpose space, the seating is recessible, and the space can be used for large group instruction, athletic training, and various community uses, i.e. Scouting activities, group gatherings, dances, community rentals, etc.

7. How often do the current exercise facilities get used?

Answer: The weight and cardio rooms are used daily for instruction in health and physical education and used daily by athletic programs. The community also uses these facilities regularly when they are accessible.

8. I sent in my paper copy. Can I have a copy to reference?

9. What does the Health Sciences Learning Center entail?

Answer: The Health Sciences Learning Center will consist of a cardio workout area and weight lifting facilities that will be used by physical education courses and within the Health curriculum. Athletics will utilize this facility and the community would have access outside of the school day while providing for the security of our students and staff through access that limits access to the rest of the school building.
