McKinney - Vento Homeless Act

Who Is Eligible?

Students who do not have a fixed, adequate, and/or regular nighttime residence, who are:

- In an emergency or transitional shelter.
- With friends or relatives due to loss of housing or economic hardship (doubled up).
- In a motel, hotel, or campground.
- In a car, bus or train station, or other public space.
- In an abandoned building or some other inadequate accommodations.
- Unaccompanied youth: youth living apart from parent(s) and no arrangements were made for the child's care or parents have denied housing.

Educational Rights

Students in temporary housing have the following rights for the duration of the school year:

- Enrollment: Immediately enroll in school and attend classes even without required documents.
- School Choice: Students may stay at the school attended when permanently housed or enroll in the school where you currently live.
- Access: Students will have access to the same programs and services that are available to all students.
- Transportation: Receive transportation assistance to/from school.
- Free Meals: Automatically eligible for free breakfast and lunch
- School Fees: Basic school fees waived.
- Students in Special Education:
 Receive special education
 services immediately, even if
 I.E.P. itself is not available.

Additional Parent Information

- Enroll your child in school as soon as possible, even if you do not have birth certificates and/or immunization records.
- Continue to provide school staff with current phone numbers and addresses.
- Talk to teachers. The more the teacher knows about your child, the more they can help your child succeed.
- Stay in communication with your School Counselor regarding your family situation and needs.
- Utilize the Mental Health Coordinator who can help connect your family with resources.
- Contact the Building Principal if you want to pursue your right to challenge eligibility, placement, and enrollment decisions.
